

Population growth shifting out of Salt Lake to Utah County



SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — New census numbers indicate that the epicenter of Utah's population growth is shifting from the state's capital to the booming Utah County just to the south, where tech jobs are helping to draw new residents.

According to U.S. Census Bureau data, Utah County and Salt Lake County are merging into one metropolitan area. Between 2014 and 2015, the Salt Lake and Utah counties each added about the same number of new residents - 14,426 in Salt Lake and 13,671 in Utah - despite Salt Lake being more than twice the size.

Independent Survey Findings

- 1 Given only the ballot language as information, 59% of those surveyed say they would support a potential school bond.
- 2 A description of growth and no tax increase are the messages that most resonate with those surveyed.
- 3 Following a series of informational messages about the bond, support jumps to 74%.




Alpine School District Survey

Four Categories Surveyed by School Level


"Please rate your overall satisfaction in the following categories related to your child's school."


Academic Performance

"Please rate your overall satisfaction with how you feel while at your child's school." Average of all school levels




School Safety Very Satisfied-**Satisfied** Dissatisfied-Somewhat 90% Dissatisfied

*<u>What can a bond be used for</u>? State law requires that bond money can only be used for constructing and upgrading schools and purchasing land for future schools. The money cannot be used for teacher and staff salaries or supplies.




"If a proposed bond does not pass in 2016, how would you rank the following to address the issue of growth in Alpine School District?"



















Proposed Bond Timeline
















ASD Bond 2016
