

# VISTA HEIGHTS PACE SCORES

The "PACE" acronym represents the Governor's initiative to achieve 66% benchmark by 2020. PACE stands for Prepare young learners, Access for all students, Complete certificates and degrees, and Economic alignment. This is the system used to illustrate how schools are performing on state tests. The scores are based on SAGE student performance and growth, which is yearend assessments given to all students during 4th term in math, science, and English.

The overall score is a combination of how many students pass the test, and how much progress each student made when compared to last year.


## PROFICIENCY SCORE: 175/300

### TEAL Time 2014-2015 Shareholder Report Summary

Last year we looked at revisions and improvements to our TEAL Time program by attending conferences on RTI, and then visiting other schools that have successfully implemented the RTI concepts to their remediation programs. This year we provided daily planners for each of our students to help them track homework and assignments, as well as to be used as tool for teachers to call specific students in for remediation on essential standards during TEAL Time. Our first term of TEAL Time produced encouraging results, as we had our lowest percentage of failing students for a term since the school opened in 2010. We continue to refine our TEAL Time program to benefit all students in meaningful ways.
