COUNSELING OFFICE

I have been a junior high teacher, administrator and counselor for 23 years. Here is the best advice I can give to parents for helping your student be successful. Thanks for all you do to help students. It is rewarding to be your partner in this process. Sincerely, John Lyman - CVJH Counseling Dept.

1. Set high expectations for your student. Most students will rise to the level of expectations set by their parents. If students miss school or get a low grade and nothing is said by a parent then students may think this is fine. When this happens, the best thing a parent can do is to notice, have a conversation about expectations and help them plan to improve.
2. Check in with your student regarding school and life. Ask them the best thing and the worst thing about school. See if they need any help. Ask them on a scale of 1-10 how happy they are.
3. Have your students earn their cell phones through performance in school. If they have a low grade, try taking away their cell phone until the grade goes up. You will be amazed at how hard they will work. If they don't have a phone and want one, have them earn it with good grades.
4. If your student is behind, have them stay after school to work with a teacher. Try printing a list of missing assignments from Skyward and have them get a teacher's signature on the list next to each assignment they complete so you can track their progress.
5. Help your student realize the options that education can create for their future. Talk to them about their plans and help them realize that higher education is a pathway to most careers. Each year the state pays \$8500 per student for school costs. Help students understand the wonderful opportunity created by 13 years of public school.
6. Help your student attend school every day unless they are sick. This year 12% of students are absent on any given day. I know some absences can't be prevented, but do what you can to help them establish good attendance habits. Over the last 3 years, CVJH students who miss less than 5% of school days have an 88% to 90% chance of passing every class all year.
7. Get weekly email updates through Skyward. This can be set up easily in just a few minutes. Your student will do better if they know that you are aware of their grades and attendance.
8. Help your student chose classes they enjoy. We are collecting finalized registration forms this month for next year. If your student hasn't involved you in the classes they chose then ask them. Requests can be adjusted until March 25. Counselors can do elective class changes until the end of the first week of each semester.
9. Talk to your student's counselor and teachers. There are a lot of ways we can help. Come to the 8th and 9th grade individual College and Career Readiness meetings to learn about ways to help your student save time and money in college and plan for their future.
10. Have your student read at home every day. This is likely the best way they can prepare now for college. The ACT test is a factor in most scholarships, and it is largely a timed reading test.

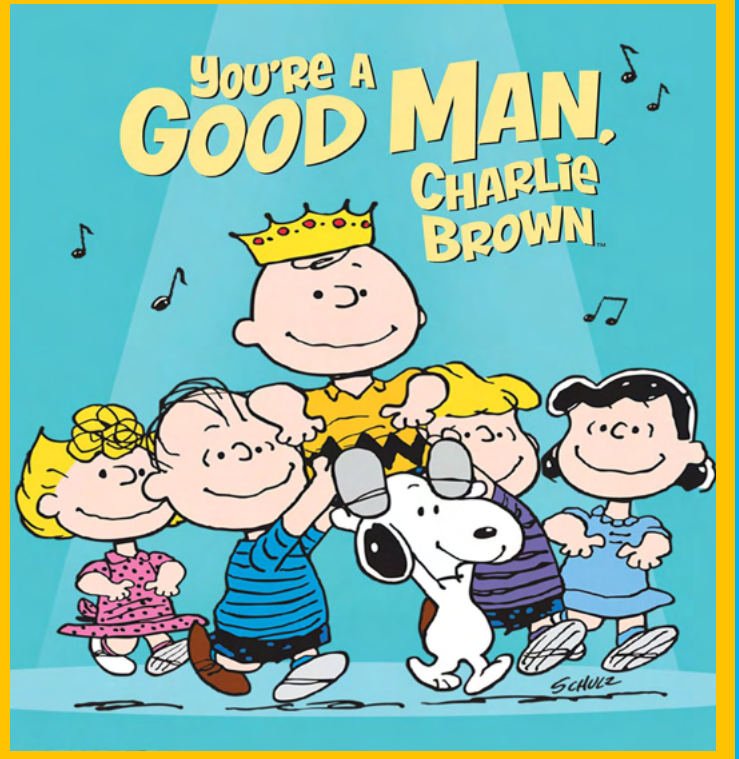

Promptness is a life long skill that we strive to teach here at Canyon View Junior High School. The intent of the Canyon View Junior High School Tardy Policy is to help promote and foster that skill. Students are encouraged to be to class on time to make sure they are ready to learn. Please help us meet that goal by encouraging your child to be to class on time. Please see the tardy policy below.

Promptness is a lifelong skill we strive to teach at CVJH!

CANYON VIEW JUNIOR HIGH TARDY THRESHOLDS

4 tardies in any class will result in a phone call home from the student's teacher.

10 tardies in all classes combined or 4 tardies in one class will result in a meeting with student, parent & administrator. 9th grade students will not be eligible to attend Lagoon day.

10+ If tardies persist, more meetings, suspensions and/or adults escorting students to class will take place. In some cases a parent will be asked to come to school to help walk their student to class.

CANYON VIEW JUNIOR HIGH TARDY MAKE UP

Tardies can be made up with the teacher where tardies were accrued. 15 minutes will make up one tardy in after school remediation.
