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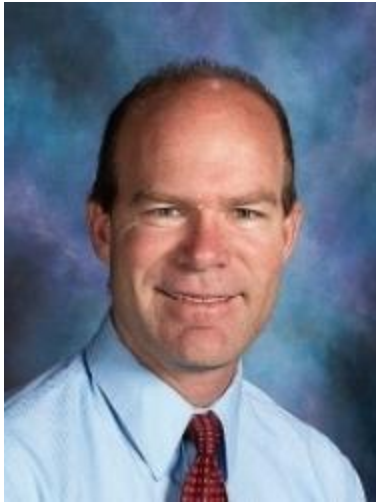
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Principal's Message

PTSA

Meals letter from Andrea Crockett

I recently sat in on a webinar discussing school meals. The discussion focused on how parents, teachers, and schools need to provide healthy food choices at lunchtime and the key being “we can do it together.” We need more nutrition education, giving consistent messages, and working with our cafeteria manager in our school. This is the 1st generation of trying to bring in healthier choices to the lunch menus and there is a learning curve. We need parent involvement if we want this to succeed. Some of the questions answered in this webinar were:

1. *Are there penalties to those schools that don't incorporate the new regulations?* No, but Federal reimbursement is only given to those schools who comply to the new regulations.

2. *What are the regulations?*

Reduce calories in school lunches with up to 650 calories for children in kindergarten through fifth grade, 700 for sixth through eighth graders and 850 for high schoolers. These foods need to have less sodium, more whole grains and a wider selection of fruits and vegetables.

3. *What are you doing about the veggies and fruits that are not great tasting?* We are trying to buy from local farmers so the vegetables and fruits have more tastes. Also, work with your cafeteria manager and PTA and see if you can get taste tests for students before items go on the menu. It's more exposure to these foods that will get the kids to enjoy them in the long run.

4. *How can parents & educators get involved?* They can look at programs such as "fueluptoplay60" and Gold medal schools and incorporate some of these ideas in their school. Also parents can come to school and eat lunch with their student. There are grants that schools can apply for such as the salad bar grant. The key is get involved.

5. *My student is hungry when they come home, why aren't they feeding my child more?* The school cafeteria gives out age appropriate calorie portions in their lunch choices. A child should be eating every 4 hours anyways, so when they get home is usually the time they should be getting hungry and eating a snack. The webinar brought up the fact that lunch menu calories doesn't give out enough calories for the child who skips breakfast. Also, athletes probably need to bring a snack to put in their lockers to eat when they get hungry between classes.

6. *How are we not being consistent with our message about food?* We talk about being healthy and wanting to do better, but then we have activities that center around sugary and fatty foods. We need more fundraisers that aren't about food (cookie dough and candy bar selling). We need more non food awards instead of candy incentives. If we are going to have cookies at a party, have more vegetable and fruit choices to choose from.

The bottom line is parents need to get involved if they want to make this new change be positive for children. Tumbleweeds Youth Film Festival

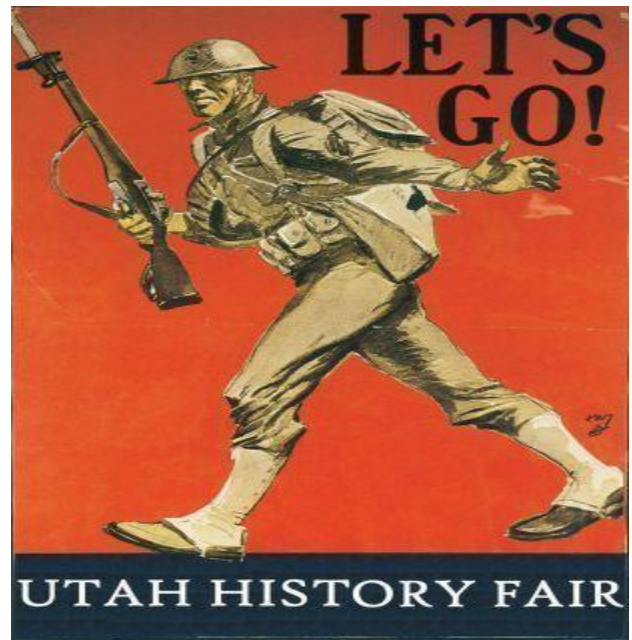

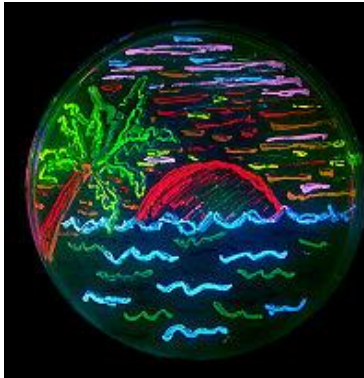
