

## Think Tank--What happens if I make a mistake? (Lesson 7)

Primary Objective	Each student will understand the process if they make a mistake.
Secondary Objective	Understand that we all make mistakes and it is better to reflect and fix our problems.
Materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Video (download ahead of time, just in case)</li> <li>○ Audio/visual setup</li> <li>○ Presentation of Think Tank Information and forms</li> <li>○ Whiteboard or screen for writing student observations</li> </ul>
Hook	Bart Simpson Big, Big, Trouble—Download and play only 0:12-1:50 ( <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MVusSqEzVHY">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MVusSqEzVHY</a> )
Content/Discussion	<p>Ask students if they have ever been in trouble.</p> <p>Tell a story about a time you did something that resulted in you being in trouble at school. Share how you felt when it happened, what the result was, and how you were able to fix your mistake, or what you learned from it.</p> <p>Emphasize that everyone makes mistakes. What is important is think about what happened and figure out how not to make the same mistake again. This is called reflection because just like looking in a mirror to see how we look, we look at our role in the situation and come up with a plan so it doesn't happen again.</p> <p>Lakeridge has created a process to help you think about a bad choice you made. If that happens, you will be sent to the "Think Tank" which is room 122</p> <p>Show PPT</p>
Reflection	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Ask students to talk with their group about why we chose Safety, Respect, Responsible and Successful as our key words.</li> <li>2. Have students think about how the Think Tank can help them avoid making a mistake in the future.</li> </ol>
