

SAGE Test

The SAGE test is a state-wide evaluation that measures our students' readiness for college and career. This evaluation measures a student's depth of knowledge in the subjects of Math, English, and Science rather than simply memorization of facts.

SAGE RESULTS:

Subject	% Proficient
Language Arts	49%
Mathematics	59%
Science	68%

94% of 9th graders leave MRJH with all necessary credits.58.6% of MRJH students earned a 3.7 or higher GPA.
