Mr. Panee is also an instructor for NASA's Summer of Innovations, which is an outreach program teaching NASA curriculum to Native American students throughout the state of Utah.

Mr. Panee is currently on sabbatical as an adjunct professor at BYU for two years, but he is still working with the Science Demo Team at Oak Canyon Jr. High. Mr. Panee is also the President-Elect for the Utah Science Teachers Association. He represents the best of who we are in the Alpine School District.

### Attendance

Books can be checked out, as long as student fines are less than \$1.00.


Late books are charged 5 cents per day.

### **Track Information**

**Pre-conditioning:** Preseason endurance training has started. We meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays (through February) at 2:25, in the weight room. Runs are structured to accommodate all ability levels. All are welcome. Come ready to run. Dress appropriately (sweats, gloves, etc.) for colder weather.

**Season information:** Two information meetings will be held (Friday, February 18 and Friday, February 25) during e-Time in the weight room. Come on either of these days for more information about the season. The season will start the week of February 28 - March 4. Four meets will be held in later March and April. The district championship will be in May.

**Events:** Sprints (100m, 200m, 400m), Distance Events (800m, 1600m, 3200m - for 9<sup>th</sup> grade), Shot Put, High Jump, and Long Jump.

To participate in meets, we must have a physical on file at school. Make a doctor appointment now, if necessary. There will be a \$15.00 participation fee to be paid before competing.
