- **5 Themes of Geography.** Location, Place, Movement, Human-environment interaction, Region.
- A map of your setting. Either found in the book, or researched on the internet. Must be self produced.

- Problems to address in your advice column.
- □ A person to feature in your obituary. They do not have to be dead in reality, this is a biography.
- □ An issue you have an opinion about. This will become your editorial article.
- **2 student choice items.** Ex. Marriage announcement, advertisements, horoscope, for sale, or want ads.
