of parents, teachers and students in the collaboration process. We are committed to all students and their success. There are many opportunities for all students to get involved. We encourage all students to find their interests and get involved in school.

We have recently received our data from the spring CRT assessment. Oak Canyon continues to be a great school. The state has made major changes regarding how student assessment data is being used to rate school effectiveness. Student proficiency and student growth are equal factors in the school score, with a possibility of 600. Anything over 400 is considered a good score. As a school Oak Canyon scored 452.

Student growth is measured each year by comparing the students' previous year's CRT scores with their current scores. Students are put into cohorts with students around the state who scored the same the year before. Their scores are then compared and student growth percentiles are calculated. The scores come from two parts: all students, which is equal to 200; and below proficient students, which is equal to 100. Student growth percentile is worth 300. The other 300 points come from the overall proficiency score.

This is the first year this scoring method has been used. This is new and exciting! As the state and schools move forward, our understanding of the data will improve, and we will continue to grow. We are excited about where we are as a school and are very proud of the faculty, staff, students and parents who are involved in this great community.






- •Last May, more than 97,000 high school students took the Advanced Placement (AP) Human Geography test nationwide, including 38 students from Oak Canyon. While only 52.2% of students pass the exam nationally, 82% of Oak Canyon students passed by scoring a 3 or above on a scale of 5. Over the past six years 177 Oak Canyon students have earned 3 semester hours of college Human Geography credit.
- •Students in guided studies are completing 80% or better of their homework. 98% of students in guided studies are passing all of their classes.
- •Oak Canyon has state of the art sound systems and projectors in each classroom. Our math classrooms all have Promethean boards.
- •100% of students who took Algebra II passed the CRT last year.
- •There is an after school 4-H program for all students who are interested in getting involved.
- •Last year Oak Canyon implemented a new tardy policy. For quarter 1 this year 93% of students have zero tardies.

Results

Utah's Criterion Referenced Test (CRT) is a test that measures student mastery of the state core curriculum. This test is administered to students at the end of the school year in Math, English, and Science classes. Mastery levels are assigned on a scale of 1 to 4. Students scoring 3 and 4 are considered proficient. The charts below show the percentages of Oak Canyon students that are proficient in each subject area. Traditionally, students at Oak Canyon have scored high on CRTs, regularly surpassing student averages from Alpine School District and the State of Utah.







SCC School Trust Land:

The School Community Council (SCC) oversees the Trust Land money received each year. Guidelines for the expenditure of this money are used to "focus on the most critical academic needs to directly impact instruction and enhance academic excellence." Oak Canyon's SCC uses Trust Land money to benefit all students at Oak Canyon. Students with academic needs are a focus for Trust Land money; in addition with our tradition of high academic success, the SCC also allocates money to programs for students who excel in school.
