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ART FOUNDATIONS 1 (A0010)

Grade Level: 7-9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

The student learns the basic elements and principles of art through drawing, painting, sculpting.

ART FOUNDATIONS 2 (A0020)

Grade Level: 8-9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

The student learns the fundamental principles and elements of design, still life, and figure drawing.

STUDIO ART (A1100)

Grade Level: 8-9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

This accelerated course is designed for 10th grade students who wish to take AP art the following year. Students review Foundations 2 as needed, plus ACE requirements for Drawing 1 and 2 at an accelerated pace. Art history, aesthetics, and art criticism will be integrated into all lessons taught. Students will begin working on original art works for an AP portfolio. Special permission is required for 9th grade students to participate in this class.

INTRO TO CERAMICS (A220)

COLLEGE AND CAREER AWARENESS (C10021)

College and Career Awareness allows student, thruogh activity-centered lsessons, to utilize technology, develope beginning skills, and explore careers. The course provides information regarding additional courses and training related to each student's carer field of interest, as they begin to prepare fo college and career.

COLLEGE AND CAREER AWARENESS (C10022)

Grade Level: 9-12 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

The business world is progressively more reliant on digital technologies. The Digital Business Applications course is designed to prepare students with the knowledge and skills to be an asset to the collaborative, global, and innovative business world of today and tomorrow. Concepts include the overall digital experience, digital communications with audio and video, and the exploration of career choices. This course also provides an understanding of business concepts and professional development in today's global office.

FACS EXPLORATION A (C30410)

Love fashion and interior design?? This course offers a fun and interesting opportunity for students to develop basic sewing skills, explore their personal fashion style, and discover how to apply the Elements and Principles of interior design. There will also be experiences in consumerism, entrepreneurship and industry-related careers.

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FACS EXPLORATION B (C30510)

Child Care/Food and Nutrition/Interpersonal Relations/Free Enterprise) This course provides students the opportunity to learn essential life skills. It allows them to develop skills in childcare, food and nutrition, family relationships, personal responsibility, consumerism, free enterprise, and job-related tasks. Student leadership (FCCLA) may be an integral part of the course. Explore fun and exciting careers in the areas of foods, childcare, and creating and running your own business. Eat yummy food, enjoy preparing to or working with young children and try your luck in running a food business. You might even discover a career you love for your future!

TEEN LIVING (C30610)

Grade Level: 9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

This course helps students understand and cope with personal, family, and social challenges. Emphasis is placed on communicating, developing decision-making skills, and building stable relationships with family and peers. The course enables students to implement positive coping mechanisms and promotes an understanding of self. Critical issues that impact teenagers, such as self-concept, family and peer relationships, abuse, loss, dating, and teenage pregnancy are discussed, stressing positive alternatives. Emphasis is placed on students taking personal responsibility for life.

SPORTS&OUTDOOR PRODUCT DESIGN1 (C3313)

Grade Level: 9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

NEW!- Sports & Outdoor Product Design I: This semester high school course is the introduction to sports and outdoor textile product design. Students will learn basic design and construction techniques, specific uses and care for outdoor textile products, and create original designs for sport/ outdoor products. Projects include a lanyard, a camping mess kit, a hooded sweatshirt, and a personalized custom athletic bag. \$10 Lab Fee

FOOD & NUTRITION I (C34010)

Grade Level: 9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

This course is designed for students who are interested in understanding the principles of nutrition and maintaining a healthy level of fitness for life. Attention will be given to the selection and preparation of food and personal health and well-being. Student leadership (FCCLA) may be an integral part of this course.

This course allows students to use their creativity while applying the elements and principles of design in the exciting world of interiors. Students will work with floor plans, color schemes, textures, fabrics, window treatments, home furnishings and equipment. Factors influencing housing choices are explored. Architectural design and furniture styles are also included in this course. Career opportunities related to housing and interior design will be examined. Student leadership (FHA/HERO) may be an integral part of this course.

CREATIVE CODING (C6011)

Grade Level: 7-8 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

Creative Coding is designed to introduce middle school students to coding and software development in a creative way. The course covers a variety of topics: Computational Thinking - This includes learning problem solving, algorithm development, and planning a solution. Collaboration - This involves teamwork, communication, project management, and good 21st Century Skills. Computing Practice & Programming - This includes the creative coding programs to provide solutions to a variety of problems. They will use tools, assets, and programming structures (sequence, loops, conditions, events, functions) to create and publish solutions.

Computers and Communications Devices - This explores the relationship between hardware and software. Community, Global, and Ethical Impacts - This includes issues of the relationships of information, technology, and humans. It also includes effects of computing on

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society.

EXPLORING TECHNOLOGY (C80110)

Grade Level: 7 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

Exploring Technology is an exciting discovery of the technological systems of four of the following eight technology areas: engineering, medical, agriculture/biotechnology, energy-power, information and communications, transportation, manufacturing and construction technologies. This course will provide opportunities for students to work individually and in a team, while also developing skills in technological design, innovation, and problem solving. there is also the opportunity to learn and practice leadership skills and participate in technological skills competitions through involvement in the Technology Student Association.

EXPLORING TECHNOLOGY (C80120)

Grade Level: 8-9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

8th Grade Exploring Technology builds upon concepts learned in 7th grade exploring technology by further expanding upon the areas of medical, agricultural, biotechnology, energy-power, information/communication, transportation, manufacturing and construction technologies. At the school level, teachers will be given the option to divide the 8th grade class into three options (A,B or C). This will allow teachers to emphasize four of the seven areas that best fit their program. There is also the opportunity to learn and practice leadership skills and participate in technological skills competitions through involvement in the Technology Student Association.

EXPLORING TECHNOLOGY (C8041)

Grade Level: 8-9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

Exploring Technology is a comprehensive action-based educational course that introduces students to the technological systems of four of the following seven technology areas: medical technologies, agriculture/biotechnology technologies, energy-power technologies, information and communications technologies, transportation technologies, manufacturing technologies, and construction technologies. The curriculum is designed around exploration of these systems and their impacts on society. Students will also develop problem-solving skills, improving career awareness for the Student Educational Occupational Plan (SEOP) development, and relate technology to math and science. Emphasis is placed on broad exploration in cooperative and individualized activities rather than project and skill development.

MANUFACTURING TECHNOLOGY (C8511)

Grade Level: 9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

Manufacturing (Woods) is an exploratory course that introduces students to the basics of manufacturing. Through hands-on shop activities students will learn how manufacturers use technology to change raw materials into finished products. Manufacturing materials include solid wood, wood composites, and laminates. Concepts also covered in this class include: design processes, properties of materials, safe use of tools and equipment, free enterprise, marketing principles, and career exploration.

INTRODUCTION TO MANUFACTURING (C8512)

Grade Level: 9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

Manufacturing (Metals) is an exploratory course that introduces students to the basics of manufacturing. Through hands-on shop activities students will learn how manufacturers use technology to change raw materials into finished products. Manufacturing materials include steel, aluminum, and various alloys. Concepts also covered in this class include: design processes, properties of materials, safe use of tools and equipment, free enterprise, marketing principles, and career exploration.

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BUSINESS OFFICE SPECIALIST (CS10o)

Grade Level: 9-12 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

An introduction to computer application software that includes word processing, spreadsheet, database, and telecommunications. An awareness of career opportunities, business ethics, and trends is included.

POPULAR LITERATURE (ENPL0)

Grade Level: 7-9 SEMESTER/ 0.500 credit(s)

The enriched curriculum will emphasize inquiry, research, creativity, and higher level thinking skills. Prior approval is required based on district testing.

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UTAH HISTORY (HUT70)

Students will be introduced to the significant events, people, cultures, and issues that have influenced Utah from its earliest beginnings through the present day. The first focus is devoted to history and events leading up to 1847 including Native Americans, Spanish, mountain men, explorers, Mormon influences, and the westward movement. The second focus includes conflicts that led to statehood and the integration of Utah into the nation including the early development of mining, railroad, industry, and agriculture; the move from territory to statehood and the new century; structure of state and local government, and the progressive period.
