


OUR VISION



Annual interest and dividends are distributed annually by the School Children's Trust Office of the Utah Office of Education, and each School Community Council (SCC) determines the highest and best use of School LAND Trust Funds for their school.




What is the SCC?

Our focus for this year has been on safety and adapting to change. This is how we will spend the \$184,723 for 2020-2021
