MESSAGE FROM MRS. ROSS

Eagles, what an incredible first week of school! We are thrilled to have you all back to school--it has been smooth and positive. Thank you for the kindness that you have extended to our new administrative team as well as to our faculty and your fellow students! Please keep up the good work! Parents, thank you for your patience with our new traffic pattern as well as our Chromebook checkout! Here are a couple of things to remember:

- Oak Canyon is a Next Generation School which means that all students have a Chromebook available to them to use at school and at home. Parents must grant permission for students to check out a Chromebook. Please refer to the section below for pertinent information.
- We have adopted the dress code piloted at the end of the school year as our official policy. Just a couple of quick reminders:
 - Clothing must be appropriate for school and cannot have words or images depicting drugs, alcohol, violence, and/or vulgarity.
 - Hats are permitted, but teachers may ask students to remove them in their individual classrooms.
 - Sleeveless tops are permitted, but all clothing must cover undergarments or where undergarments would be.
 - While we understand that cropped tops are the style at the moment, bare midriffs are not permitted. Please be mindful of this when selecting a cropped shirt.
- We are implementing a new tardy policy this year, so please be advised that students that are 0-7 minutes tardy need to go directly to their classes. Their teachers can mark them tardy in the classroom. Students that are over 7 minutes tardy will need to check in at the office for a tardy slip. We have also increased the passing period between classes from 5 to 7 minutes. The goal is for students to be in class and to be on time! So far so good, we appreciate your support with this new policy.
