MESSAGE FROM MRS. ROSS

Oak Canyon Junior High School has a guiding Mission, Vision, and Values. Our mission is, "Together, We Learn for Life." In the graphic on the left you can see the behaviors we desire to see amongst OCJH students, staff, parents, etc. The third statement indicates that "we notice and encourage growth." Both adults and students alike crave feedback and validation that they are on the right track.--both want to feel success. That said, oftentimes the success we seek is an end result: a score on an assessment, a final grade in a class, an overall GPA. When the end result is different than that which we sought, any growth experienced on the journey toward that end result is invalidated. That can cause some to engage in negative self-talk, or even worse decide that their efforts will never be enough and that success is beyond their reach. We'd like to challenge that thinking and deliberately celebrate and acknowledge the growth experienced along the way of producing results. We aim to do this by presencing appreciation for and acknowledgement of the efforts expended by the members of our school community--students, parents, faculty, volunteers, etc. These efforts can be academic and social/behavioral. As we intentionally seek to notice and celebrate growth in ourselves and in others, we will start to see growth everywhere. With growth comes the belief that continuous improvement is important--maybe even more important than the end result we were seeking in the first place. I challenge all in the Oak Canyon School Community to actively notice, encourage, and celebrate, growth in

themselves and others. It's going to be a GREAT week!

Fee Waiver Applications are due by September 30th. This application needs to be completed and turned in every school year along with current documentation for proof of qualification. CHROMEBOOK REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT COSTS

Now that students have received their Chromebooks we are starting to perform repairs and replacements on damaged machines. This is what you need to know:

- Please remind your students that they are responsible to take care of these district owned machines. Chromebooks are quite durable, but if thrown around in backpacks, slammed shut repeatedly, dropped, etc., they will become damaged.
- 2. Students are responsible to pay for damages they cause to their Chromebook. The repairs/replacement costs are as follows:
 - a. Minor Tamporing \$10
 - b. Replacement Charging Cord \$30
 - c. Screen/Other Replacement \$150
 - d. Replacement Device \$150
- 3. When a chromebook is being repaired, the school has some loaner devices that can be used by students in the meantime. However, in order for a student to get back their assigned Chromebook after it has been repaired/replaced, they will need to pay the charged fee first.
- 4. Insurance is available on these devices for \$25 per year. Click <u>here</u> if you would like to learn more.

STUDENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO CHECK OUT A CHROMEBOOK WITHOUT PARENT PERMISSION. Permission can be granted in Skyward by parents/guardians. In the instance of lost, stolen, or damaged Chromebooks, **insurance** can be purchased for \$25 for the whole school year. Otherwise, the cost to replace a Chromebook is \$150. Click on the link below for insurance information: *Purchasing Chromebook Insurance*

If you would like to **manage your student's Chromebook at home**, we are pleased to inform you about an app called Blocksi. Blocksi allows parents to pause the internet, to set a "bedtime" for the Chromebook, to create a list of restricted sites, etc. when the Chromebook is in use at home. ASD has various filters and restrictions in place when the students are at school, but we desire students to be safe online at home as well. Click here to learn more about Blocksi:
