NEW INFORMATION:

CHROMEBOOK WELLNESS CHECK AND 8TH GRADE TURN IN DATE

Students will have a Chromebook wellness check in their science classes this Wednesday and Thursday (5/17 & 5/18) and need to come to school with their Chromebooks and chargers. Chromebooks should be fully charged and stickers removed for this check. If you do not have a science class, have your chromebook checked in the Library or Office. 8th graders will turn in their Chromebooks on Friday as they will be issued a brand new Chromebook as 9th graders to last them through high school. 7th and 9th graders will keep their chromebooks over the summer to use again in the fall as 8th and 10th graders.

9TH GRADE LAGOON INFORMATION

This is a reminder for any 9th grader wanting to go to Lagoon that they must purchase a ticket by 11:59 PM on Tuesday, May 16. Tickets are \$54 and can be purchased at the financial office or through myschoolfees.com. They must also have a signed permission slip to attend. Please go to the Oak Canyon website for a link to the permission slip and myschoolfees.com found in the slider across the top. Please note the following:

- Students will sign up for a Chaperone during Rad Time on Wednesday, May 17.

- Students will need a ride to the Orem Central Trax Station (1350 W. 900 So. Orem) at **6:50 AM**. They will find their chaperone at the Trax Station to ride up together. Chaperones will distribute students' Lagoon tickets when they arrive at Lagoon.
- Parents are not permitted to drop students off at Lagoon. If they miss their designated train at their designated time with their group, they will forfeit their chance to go to Lagoon. Refunds will not be issued.
- Outside food is not permitted at Lagoon. Students will need to bring money to purchase lunch and any snacks at the park.
- Students must be on their best behavior on Trax and at Lagoon. If a problem arises, a student will have to wait in a designated area until a parent can arrange to pick them up at Lagoon.
- Students will meet their chaperones and groups at 3:00 PM in the Lagoon parking lot to take a bus back to the Trax station to catch the 3:39 PM Trax train back to Orem. That train will arrive at the Orem Central Station at 5:03 PM.
- Students will need to be picked up at the Orem Central Trax Station.

MAY 25--YEARBOOK/FIELD DAY INFORMATION

Thursday, May 25, students who have purchased a yearbook will receive them in their A1 class. We will be running an 8 period schedule that day so students can rotate through all of their classes before lunch. REMINDERS:

DRESS CODE REMINDER

With temperatures going up, we anticipate more dress code infractions. Just a reminder that students are permitted to wear sleeveless tops and midriff exposure should be minimal.
