

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

I had some important interactions with students last week. One was an informal conversation with students in my office after school one day. As I asked if their school year was off to a good start, they seemed a little surprised about how well it was going so far. They mentioned that they couldn't put their finger on why, but that things feel



different at Oak Canyon this year. They assured me that in this case different meant better. I asked them to elaborate, and they said that it just feels "kinder," "softer..." A few days later, I walked past a classroom during Homeroom. I heard the teacher say, "I've already told you why we are doing Homeroom this year." I took that as an opportunity to duck in and answer questions that students might have about Homeroom. I explained that last spring, we surveyed students to see their biggest needs and how we can better serve them at OCJH. From those surveys, we found that there is a need for greater connection with students. I commented that it is a really

special thing that every student at OCJH has a teacher who's purpose in having them in class is to get to know them and to help them feel seen and important at school. On Friday, I was checking in on different Homeroom classrooms and was delighted to see in just one corner of the school a team building activity with floating vessels and pennies, a snow cone party, a kickball tournament between Homeroom classes, and a class enjoying the

beautiful day walking around the track. A student made sure to tell me that she loves Homeroom and that it should be a full class period each day. I realize that we are still working out some of the details, but I agree that OCJH feels different this year, and I think Homeroom has a lot to do with it! It's going to be another great week!

The window to purchase insurance is shrinking--students have 30 days after receiving their device to sign up - that puts us at around Sept 17-21. 

SCHOOL FEES



23-24 BELL SCHEDULE--HOMEROOM AND WEDNESDAY EARLY OUT CHANGES



There are two major changes to our schedule this year: the addition of homeroom 4 times a week, and Wednesday early out day changing from two hours early to only one. Please note the updated bell schedule.

Homeroom: This year, each student will be assigned a homeroom class between A1/B5 and A2/B6. Homeroom is 27 minutes on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Students will be mixed with students from their entire grade level as well as some students from the grade level above or below them. The idea for Homeroom came from our teachers as we brainstormed ways that we could intentionally pursue our Vision for Learning as a school and create authentic connections with students. We will be using curriculum from a local company

called In Focus to help us deliberately develop the skills and dispositions listed in the message above. The first four weeks of school we will be discussing the following topics: 8/16 What it Means to Be an Eagle/Lifelong Learning; 8/21 Conditions of Well Being (safety, basic needs); 8/28 Connection and Community Building; and 9/4 Academic Skills. In Focus materials for parents will be shared soon. We are excited about this new opportunity for teachers and students alike.

Wednesday Early Out Day: Please note that school will be adjourned at 1:15 on Wednesdays this year. This means that we will run a two lunch schedule like we do on a regular day and conclude the day with A4/B8 rather than a shared lunch. Please note this change and plan accordingly.
