Academic progress and success will be measured using grades and credit. Students who have earned at least 7 total credits in ninth grade, including all four core credits, will be considered on track.

Action Steps

1. We will track the # of F grades per quarter for 7th, 8th, and 9th grades. We will record the number of 9th graders who are deficient credit at the end of each quarter, and at the end of the school year. Student Success Teams (SSTs) will monitor students who are receiving F grades within their assigned groups weekly.

2. We will work with at-risk students individually as counselors and administrators, and have student advocates to track and follow up individually with students.

3. We will provide six periods of Guided Study, including math tutors in each section. Teachers will work in direct instruction with students. This class will provide additional study time and oneon-one help for students who have been identified as at risk of becoming deficient in credit.

4. We will invest in continually improving the quality of our Tier 1 and Tier 2 instruction through school-wide teacher leadership, Professional Development, and summer collaboration time for teachers.

5. We will provide school-wide Tier 1 instruction on our school values, academic habits and student well being. Lessons will be developed/curated by our Social Emotional Lesson Team and delivered by all teachers. Teachers will work in direct instruction with students.

6. In addition, our plan aligns with the Alpine TSSA funding for students wellness by allowing us to hire additional supports beyond our Trust Lands budget to fully staff advocates, math tutors, general aides, and to fund the development and implementation of additional student wellness structures noted above.
