PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



For the next month we will be spending time in Homeroom talking about Citizenship and the 4 indicators associated with it at Oak Canyon. This past week we had an incredible experience with our 7th and 8th graders while the 9th graders were ASPIRE testing. Our 8th grade students had the opportunity to job shadow off-site as part of their CCA standards. Students submitted pictures of themselves on the job and submitted reflections about what they learned were essential skills to have in the workplace. It was absolutely thrilling to see how many of them included the 6 Cs as essential workplace skills. The most frequently mentioned skill is that of collaboration. Our 7th graders participated in a board game design challenge on-site as part of their Digital Literacy class. Students were to create a game that would bridge

generational divides. They had time to brainstorm, prototype, and then play and refine their games. We were able to hear from one of the top names in game design, Grandpa Beck, who is most well known for his game Cover Your Assets. Grandpa Beck spoke to us from Washington about his process in creating games and then announced that he is sending a copy of Cover Your Assets to every 7th grader at Oak Canyon! It was a thrill! After that, all of the 7th graders moved to the gym and played each other's games for an hour. We even had a few teachers create their own games after being inspired by the students. The 7th graders also reflected on how vital the 6 Cs were in this design challenge. It was such an important day. It was amazing to see and hear about students being engaged in real-world tasks and seeing the value of what we've been explicitly studying all year in Homeroom. We look forward to our 9th graders having their extension activity when the 7th and 8th grade students take their RISE

tests next week. Please see more details about that below. If you haven't had the chance to talk to your 7th/8th grade students about their experiences on the 10th, please do so, you won't be disappointed!
