APRIL 10--VERY IMPORTANT, PLEASE READ:

ASPIRE is the name of one of the two state tests coming up in April. **On Wednesday, April 10, our 9th grade students will take the ASPIRE test.** 9th grade teachers will proctor that test. It will take a majority of the day, but

students will have multiple breaks as well as a lunch break during the testing. On the 10th, 8th grade students will have their job shadowing assignment offsite. The expectation is that all 8th grade students will participate in the job shadowing experience. If your student does not have someone to shadow, please have them reach out to their CCA teacher ASAP to find an alternative way to meet the CCA job shadowing standard. Our 7th grade students will be onsite this day and will have the opportunity to participate in an engineering and design task that is part of their Digital Literacy class. We don't want to give away all of the details yet, but it will be a day to remember for certain! PLEASE NOTE: The week of April 22nd, our 7th and 8th grade students will complete the RISE tests three different mornings while our 9th graders participate in a project related to their World Geography/Civilization class.
