#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Last week, we had a safety scare at Oak Canyon. A threat of school violence was spreading on social media across the country, and it made its way to our school. We had students and parents reporting this threat to us en masse. I want to thank everyone that reported this to us--that is exactly what should have happened. Working in partnership with the Lindon Police Department, we were able to ascertain quickly that the threat of school violence on social media was not directed at Oak Canyon, nor did it originate in Utah. In fact, this particular threat had been making the rounds via social media for about two weeks. We are grateful to the Lindon PD for helping us get to the bottom of this situation, and also for their willingness to be available on-site to help students feel more safe and secure. We sent out a guick email to parents to

let them know what was going on, and we also made a quick announcement to the students that there was no credible threat in the building. Within 5 minutes of the announcement/email everything completely calmed down. It was a sobering reminder of the trust that families and students place in us to keep everyone safe. It is a huge job, especially in the day and age in which we live. We all have a role to play in school safety. This was a perfect example of how all members of our school community were able to do their part to address a safety concern in a timely manner. Well done, Eagles. 
a teacher than for a brief check in, please reach out to the teacher directly to find a time to properly address your student's needs.


