Utah has an abundance of natural resources. As these resources are extracted, they are taxed which can amount to tens of millions of dollars each year. The money goes into a general fund and is spent as it is earned. Amendment B would direct those revenues into a trust fund that will eventually get large enough that the interest alone can sustain many government programs, especially education. The legislature has already established a Permanent State Trust Fund, and once voters approve Constitutional Amendment B, lawmakers can begin building the fund with severance tax money.

Grades to Success is a program developed and ran by Rachel Quintana. It encourages students to not only raise their grades but to become involved and participate in school activities, doing service for others, make a connection with their teachers, and by setting goals to become successful in school. When they earn money they can spend it the in-school store that Ms. Quintana has set up. All students are encouraged to participate.

• Summer Collaboration Reports

Fine Arts: Mr. Winters collaborated this summer with other junior high orchestra teachers in the district. They began creating a structure of assessments for their beginning students, and a new rubric scoring system for testing. Mr. Winters reported that this has been a great beginning and has seen an improvement with students.

Social Studies: Social Studies Department spent 6 days over the summer revamping question 2 "How will we know what students have learned?" and they also changed the standard for grading. Students receive a unit card so they know the standards they need to pass. Students either get one's or a zero. If they receive a one they are 80% proficient and the only letter grades given are A, B, C or I's. Each student has the choice to achieve the grade they want.

Hope Squad: Had a constructive group retreat where a suicide survivor spoke to them.

Bradley Group: The Bradley Group is a grief group from BYU who have very effectively worked with our students who have recently dealt with a death of a loved one. They meet with our students every other Friday. There are currently 15 students involved with the group.

Data Review

We are receiving better information from SAGE testing data. Data compares Orem Jr. to other junior highs in the state that our in the same demographic group. Language Arts proficiency results were 36.2% with a growth score of 51. Math proficient results were at 37.4% with a growth score of 42.5. Science proficient results were 39.5% with a growth rate of 46. Mr. Jolley will meet with each of the above departments to discuss the data results which should be beneficial to them.

- Jennifer Fitzgerald (District SCC) wanted to add to next month's agenda a discussion on what is our school doing about cyberbullying? She also wanted to make sure that our webpage met all the state SCC guidelines, which we are current and compliant.
- Action Item—Discuss and approve budget revision from Equipment to Professional Development
 Two budgets have been overspent. Hourly Certified Salary Budget -\$2,267.40 and Benefits Budget -\$1,1178.90 totaling to -\$3,446.30. Krystin Carter-Sanchez made the motion to move \$5,446.30 which includes an additional \$2,000.00 out of Computer Equipment Budget and move it to the two accounts to cover overages. Andrea Mangum seconded the motion. The board voted unanimously supporting the motion.
